Description

This program is designed to provide individuals with the knowledge and skills required to provide basic life support measures including performing CPR in line with the Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) guidelines until medical aid arrives.

Course Content

Theory

- Principles of first aid
- DRSABCD Action Plan
- Duty of Care
- Assess vital signs
- Recognise the need for CPR and CPR techniques
- Infection control
- Reporting and recording an emergency
- Understanding the use of an Automated External Defibrillator Unit (AED)

- The Chain of Survival
- First aid procedures for shock, bleeding and wounds Respiratory and cardiac emergencies
- Acute medical emergencies

Practical

- Perform simulated CPR for 2 minutes (Adult, child and baby)
- Use an AED (trainer model)
- Responding as a first aider in several scenarios

Prerequisites

There are no specific pre-requisites for this course although learners should ensure they do not suffer from a medical condition which could be aggravated by physical or psychological stress and must be over 18 years of age.

Assessment

The theory assessment consists of multiple choice and short answer questions.

The practical assessment will require Learners to demonstrate the ability to respond in an emergency and apply first aid procedures including CPR, use of an AED, allergic reactions, anaphylaxis, bleeding control, choking and airway obstruction, respiratory distress, including asthma and shock.

Language, Literacy and Numeracy

There are specific language, literacy and numeracy requirements for some of the content of this course, to be deemed competent you must be able to:

- Read and correctly interpret required documentation relevant to the assessment and management of injuries/illnesses
- Speak clearly and unambiguously in English
- Explain, describe and verify sometimes complex needs and issues

Writing is required to the level of completing workplace forms and producing the required reports.
